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⁶⁶ While Peter was below in the courtyard, one of the servant-girls of the high priest came by. ⁶⁷ When she saw Peter warming himself, she looked closely at him. ‘You also were with that Nazarene, Jesus,’ she said. ⁶⁸ But he denied it. ‘I don’t know or understand what you’re talking about,’ he said, and went out into the entrance.



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⁶⁹ When the servant-girl saw him there, she said again to those standing round them, 'This fellow is one of them.'

⁷⁰ Again he denied it. After a little while, those standing near said to Peter, 'Surely you are one of them, for you are a Galilean.'



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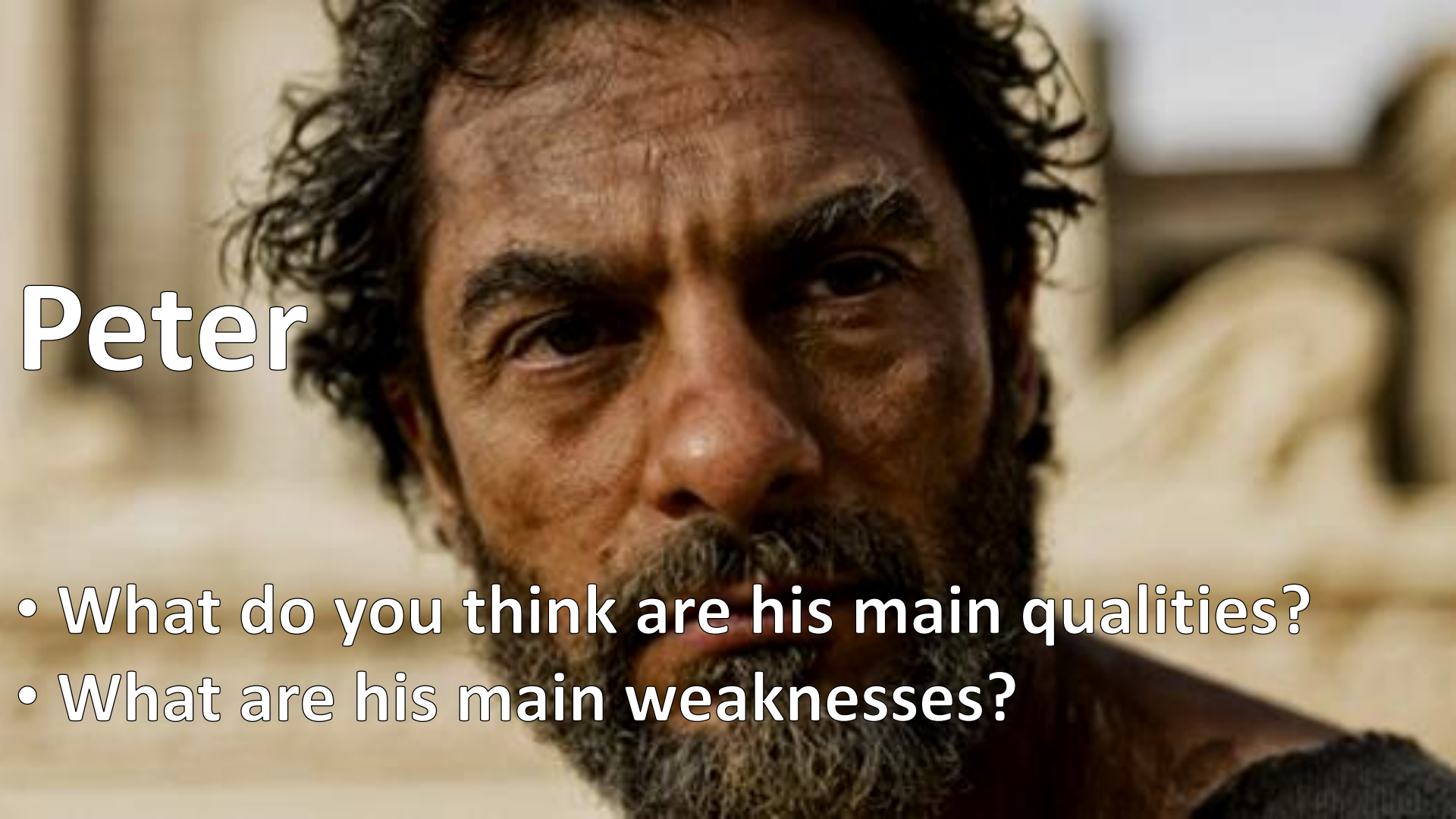

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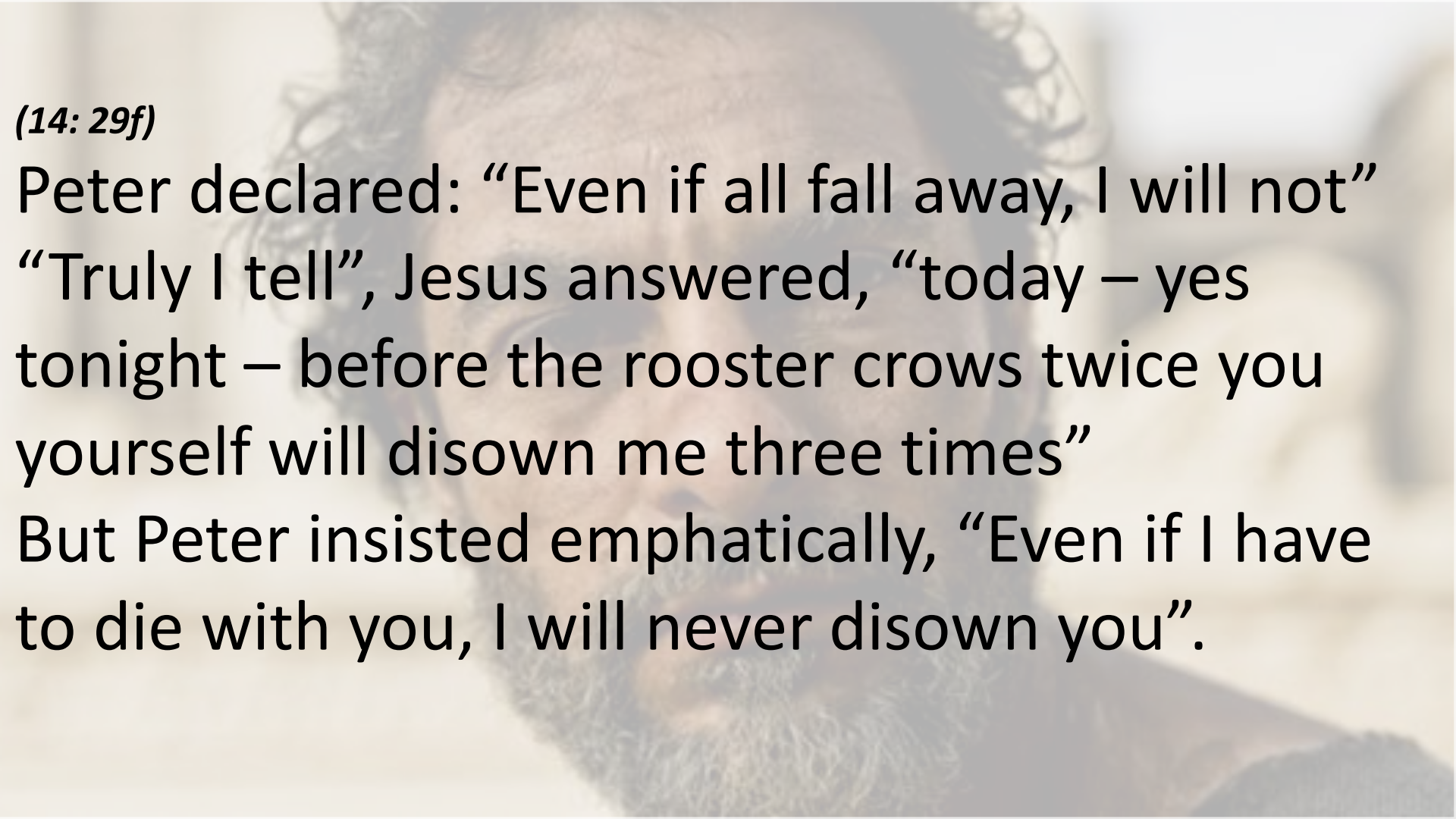
⁷¹ He began to call down curses, and he swore to them, 'I don't know this man you're talking about.'
