‘śāmaḥ’

“to rejoice, be glad, delight in;
exceeding glad”



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‘śimḥâ’

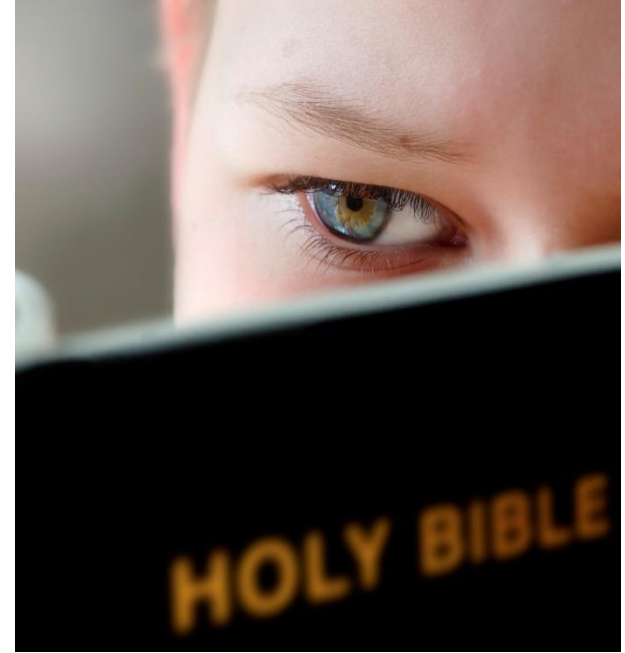
(pronounced ‘sim-khaw’)
