Kerry Stillman

Kerry works in Cameroon as part of a church-planting team working among the Fulbe people who are traditionally Muslim. Kerry and her team used to live in the north of the country where, as well as being involved in church planting, they ran a hospital. In 2014, because of the security situation in the north, the team moved further south, where they have continued their ministry of church-planting, and at the same time continue to oversee the work of the hospital.

Latest news from Kerry:

Kerry has recently returned to Cameroon, having had several months in the UK on home leave. She used this time catching up with friends and family, relaxing, and sharing about her work in Cameroon.

Kerry is happy to be back with her team in Cameroon and encouraged as they plan together for the future.

Three of the team are travelling up to their hospital in the far north today, Sunday, for a few days and would appreciate prayer for their visit to be an encouragement to the hospital staff and Fulbe believers.

Security in Cameroon is still unpredictable, with a few destabilising situations going on at present.

Many of the Fulbe hear the gospel and then do not respond with open hearts, so please pray that Kerry will be able to discern what the Holy Spirit is doing in people's hearts.

Give thanks:

- That Kerry has settled back into life in Cameroon after a good home leave
- That Kerry has been able to talk with some of the Fulbe believers since she has got back
- That the Fulbe believers are continuing to follow Jesus despite their own trials and struggles

Please pray:

- That Kerry and the team will be kept safe and will be able to stay in Cameroon as long as they are needed to help the Fulbe believers become a thriving part of the body of Christ
- For Kerry to have wisdom to know which contacts to reconnect with
- For the Fulbe believers to grow in faith, boldness and vision to reach their people with the gospel
