Kerry Stillman

Kerry works in Cameroon as part of a church-planting team working among the Fulbe people who are traditionally Muslim. Kerry and her team used to live in the north of the country where, as well as being involved in church planting, they ran a hospital. In 2014, because of the security situation in the north, the team moved further south, where they have continued their ministry of church-planting, and at the same time continue to oversee the work of the hospital.

Latest news from Kerry:

"In May we had a large gathering to celebrate the printing and dedication of the Arabic script Fulbe Bible. Many Fulbe believers attended from near and far - it was wonderful to see so many gather in one place at the same time as that doesn't happen very often. It was a great opportunity for them to meet each other and network. Many phone numbers were exchanged and new friendships made. Some who came didn't know there were so many other Fulbe believers like themselves, so it was a real encouragement for them. Six of our group from the far north were able to come too, so it was great to see them joining in the celebrations.

A young Fulbe woman, R, has been meeting with me and another member of our team twice a week for the last few months for Bible study. She recently decided to become a follower of Jesus! She counted the cost of following Jesus as she knew her family would be against her decision. She has already shared her new faith with her grandmother, who is also listening to audio Bible stories, but her grandmother has cautioned her to keep doing her Muslim prayers so as not to upset the family.

By the time you read this, I should have just arrived back in Cameroon from a great trip to USA to a church-planting conference run by Pioneers (my mission agency). It was wonderful to meet up with friends who have previously worked with us in Cameroon, and other missionaries from around the world. I was also able to visit family and friends in the UK on my way back, which was great."

- The amazing celebration of the Fulbe Bible and for the encouragement the Fulbe believers have been to each other
- R and others like her who have recently made the decision to follow Jesus
- The conference in the USA and time in the UK seeing family and friends

Please pray for:

- Kerry as she reconnects with contacts and believers on her return to Cameroon this week, and that she can be an encouragement to them
- Believer MT to grow in his faith and to continue to boldly share good news with others
- That the new Fulfulde Bible in arabic script will draw many Fulbe to Jesus
- For God's mercy to rain down on Cameroon - there are several security issues and the prospect of instability looms

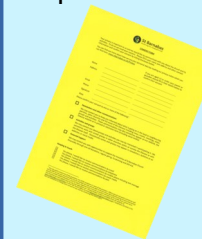
If you are a newcomer and would like more information, then please take and complete one of our **Connect Forms**, which you will find at the back of church and/or in the Offering Baskets as they come round.
